As with earlier editions, which date back to the first edition in 1978, this book is designed first and foremost for classroom instruction. It is structured to introduce students to the major issues in the field of family law with a particular emphasis on 21st century case law and statutes, model codes, and other materials, and is written with an eye toward putting the study of family law in touch with the social world it is a dynamic part of.

As previous editions have done, this book draws on a variety of sources—historical and contemporary, legal and non-legal—in order to emphasize the complex and wide-ranging dynamics of family life, as well as their highly personal and interpersonal stakes, which the law must recognize and address somehow. This new edition builds on the well-known strengths of earlier editions' treatment of family law's many equality themes, offering deep engagements at family law's intersection with different axes of inequality, including race, ethnicity, sex, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation and identity, and class. The book is also enriched with practical materials, including questions and problems, designed to allow students to confront some of the high stake issues in the field in practice-simulating ways.

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
